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BSRC SUPER SERIES



After a gap of six weeks The British Superkart Racing Club's Super Series rolls into Donington Park with four classes in action over the two days. This will be rounds 7, 8 and 9 for the Division 1 and F250 Mono categories while the F450 National and F125 Open classes began their campaign at Trac Mon in Anglesey last month.

Heading the points in the Division 1 category after a maximum score at Anglesey is Liam Morley, the 2020 BSRC Club Champion and Grand Prix winner at Donington last September. Liam's 2023 Super Series campaign started with a second place at Cadwell in April, but a crash while lapping a backmarker and subsequent non-start dropped him back to 10th place in the standings. However, with the three wins at Anglesey last month he is right back at the top and looks set to continue that success this weekend at Donington. Who will stop him?

Leading the way in the F250 Mono Super Series is five-time MSA British Superkart Champion Paul Platt. He racked up a maximum score of three wins at Cadwell, also claiming the Super Cup, and added another win at Anglesey. A second place was then followed by a rare retirement when a rear wheel came off due to broken studs. Paul will put that loss of points behind him and will be looking to extend his lead of 12 over the three races at Donington.

The F450 National four-stroke class should see an interesting contest. In the opening rounds at Anglesey last month Catherine Foster picked up two wins and a third to sit at the top of the points table and also won the class Super Cup.

Reigning BSRC Club Champion Nick Flint had to be content with a fourth and a pair of second places to hold second spot, with Mary Howarth only eight points behind in third. Kevin Ridley Walsh, the designer and manufacturer of the Silverstone chassis had a rare outing at Anglesey and won the opening round. A big oil leak in the second race curtailed any chance of adding further points for the rest of the day. He will be looking to make amends at Donington. Also looking to challenge are reigning Motorsport UK British Champion Kosta Kyritsis, 'Queen' of Cadwell Ami Jerger, Ronan McClintock and Jason Thompson who have all had class wins in the past.

Shane Stoney, Grand Prix winner in 2022, heads the F125 Open class. He picked up five wins in the Super Series last year and should be on the top of the podium again. He reverts back to his GP wanning Anderson DEA combination this weekend after trying out the beautifully restored Anderson AK TM of Clark Motorsport. That will be in the hands of Ollie Holmes at Donington. Ollie made his long circuit debut at Cadwell Park in April after spending a couple of years racing in the 125cc retro class on short circuits. A big crash at Cadwell, fortunately escaping serious injury wasn't the best way to start the season, but he was back in action at Anglesey in the F250 Mono class. Unfortunately, the F125 Open Super Series class leader Ella Stevens is not competing this weekend so that should give Stoney the opportunity to move up from third place in the points.

With so many Superkarts on track the action all weekend is expected to be close. Who will emerge out of Roberts Chicane to take the class wins?



Miata Trophy has roared into life this year, with the new-for-2023 championship having enjoyed four breathtaking rounds across two fine circuits. Now, on July 15, Miata Trophy returns at the renowned Donington Park for the next two outings of Mazda MX-5 action.

A circuit steeped in motorsport heritage, Donington Park offers competitors and their machinery a number of distinct challenges. An array of difficult corners combine with fast flowing bends and surging straights for an ultimate driving experience. A notable highlight of the lap is the legendary Cramer Curves and Old Hairpin. For decades this section of track has thrilled drivers, as it's demanding nature results in pure elation when mastered. Miata Trophy's Mk1 and Mk3 MX-5 competitors will need to get their eye in quickly in qualifying, as only the top five in each class will progress to SuperPole.

SuperPole has already delivered a whole heap of excitement in it's opening two editions and all eyes will be keenly focused on seeing which driver tops the highpressure session this time out. With how competitive the Miata Trophy field has proved to be so far this season, we expect stiff competition for both SuperPole and the two 20-minute sprint races that follow.

Last time out, at Anglesey, spectators were treated to two exceptional races. There was a great number of fabulous overtakes and hard-but-fair racing on display, including an epic battle for the overall top step in both races between Declan Lee and John Langridge. Ultimately, both drivers left Wales with a race victory apiece and a haul of important championship points. If the action is half as exciting as it was at Anglesey, we're in for a treat at Donington Park.

The Class NC and overall championship standings couldn't be much closer, as only two points separate the leading pair – Miller Motorsport #5 and Hills Motorsport #12. The pair have amassed a small buffer over current Class NA championship leader Liam Cochrane (Turner Property Services Racing) and fourth-placed Alex Miller (Miller Motorsport #7), but with over half the season still remaining there is plenty of racing still to be had this year. Donington Park, Miata Trophy is ready for you.



TECH TALK

DESCRIPTION

Miata Trophy is a one make Championship for the mk1 and mk3 Mazda MX-5. Racing together yet scoring points separately, allows cars from either class to take the overall championship title.

RACES

Two 20 minute sprint races follow a 15 minute qualifying, and the SuperPole session, a one lap dash to determine the top five grid positions in each class!

POINTS AND REWARDS

Points will be awarded to competitors listed as classified finishers within their class as follows: 50, 47, 44, 42, 40, 38, 36, 34, 32, 30, 28, 26, 24 then decreasing by 2 points down the results until 24th in class where by all remaining classified finishers in class will receive 2 points. Points will also be allocated to the top three in each class from the qualifying session, and for the fastest lap of the race in each class. Reduced points totals will be applied to classes with less than ten starters.

Control parts include, control tyre Toyo Proxes R888R tyre for the mk3 MX-5 NC class, and a pre-buffed Toyo Proxes TR1 for the mk1 MX-5 NA class, and control GAZ Gold coilovers suspension, amongst other items. Further details can be found on the Miata Trophy website.

SRCC SPORTS 2000 CHAMPIONSHIP



Flying down through the Craner Curves is one of the greatest thrills in UK motorsport and Sports 2000 cars will be approaching 120 mph as they approach the Old Hairpin. This weekend they are running four races two for the Historic cars and two for the faster Duratec engined cars. Michael Gibbins has dominated the podium this year in his updated MCR but reigning champion Josh Law has challenged him all the way and he will be looking to get his campaign back to winning ways and return to the top step of the podium here at Donington. Richard Johnson has shown good speed this year and will be keen to make amends for an uncharacteristic error at Brands Hatch. Paul Travhurn in the Gunn has also shown a good turn of speed and it's good to see former champion Tom Stoten back out in his Gunn after a spot of paternity leave.

Patrick Sherrington is a guest driver in the UWTSD car sharing with Tim Tudor. Patrick holds the lap record for these cars set at 1.09.505 when he was in the factory run MCR in 2013 but Gibbins and Law have been showing the pace that should beat that this weekend. The enthusiasm of the students who prepare and run the two UWTSD cars and often lend a hand elsewhere is one of the highlights of the series and it's great to see them progressing into professional careers in motorsport. The series has attracted enthusiastic support not only from Apsley House Capital plc and BS Burners Limited but also Yokohama who have supported this series

for over 25 years, one of the longest tyre supply agreements in motorsport. Sports 2000 is also grateful to Raceparts UK, Varley Batteries and Vision Motorsport Engineering Products for their support.

Historic Sports 2000 often provides really close racing with drivers such as the three members of the Hyett family, Mike Fry, Chris Snowdon and Paul Streat fighting for the win. Streat set a new lap record last year at 1.13.94 and it's good to see Patrick Egan rejoining the series in another Lola. Shrikes, Lolas, Tigas and Royales provide a good variety of manufacturers and they should all be looking their best. It's also good to see John Deane-Bowers back on track in his Tiga after a six year sabbatical and a big welcome to Mark Hobbs who made his series debut in another Tiga at Castle Combe. This is club racing at its best and spectators are always welcome to get a closer look in the paddock where rivals can often be seen helping repair each other's cars.

Classes for older cars and older drivers mean everyone has something to fight for, so battles take place throughout the field. A total of 36 cars will take to the track this weekend across the two categories, a testament to the enduring popularity of these fast, cost-effective cars that attract drivers of all ages some of whom take the adage of 'you only get old when you stop racing' very seriously while others are just starting out on their racing careers.

BLUE (STEADY) Another competitor is close.

BLUE (WAVED) Another competitor is trying to pass.

WHITE Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit.

YELLOW (WAVED)

Danger, slow down sufficiently to ensure that full control of the vehicle can be retained. No overtaking.

YELLOW (DOUBLE WAVED)

Great danger. Slow down considerably. Be prepared to suddenly change from the projected racing line, or take other evasive action including stopping if necessary. No overtaking. (This signal may be supplemented or replaced by flashing yellow light(s), as an added warning).

YELLOW/RED STRIPES Slippery surface ahead.

GREEN (WAVED)

All dear, at the end of a danger area controlled by yellow flags. Also used to signal the start of a formation lap and shown at all posts during first lap of each practice session and during the formation lap.

RED

STOP RACING, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by marshals (at startline & individual marshal's posts). Race stopped.

BLACK/ORANGE DISK

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to driver; call into pits immediately.

BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL

Warning to driver that his/her behaviour (e.g. corner cutting) is suspect and he/her may be black flagged.

BLACK

Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.

BLACK & WHITE CHEQUERED End of the race.
