The time has come for Miata Trophy's highlyanticipated trip to Oulton Park and the penultimate race event of the championship's debut season. From a truly phenomenal inaugural race meeting on the Brands Hatch Grand Prix circuit, to a challenging Snetterton encounter last month, it's been a thoroughly enjoyable season of racing and excitement levels couldn't be higher for a visit to Cheshire.

A key reason why so much excitement surrounds this upcoming meeting is the potential significance it could have on the championship's final standings. After two rounds in Norfolk in August, we now have a third different overall championship leader in the form of Declan Lee (Hills Motorsport #12). Lee and his fellow competitors will all be looking to maximise their points haul at Oulton Park, knowing just two rounds remain once the weekend is completed. The racing all season in Miata Trophy has been exceptional, with well-contested, firm-but-fair battling throughout the field being the precedent. Given the added hunger from drivers to finish as high up the order as possible, Oulton Park has all the potential to be an instant classic.

As briefly mentioned, Declan Lee now leads the way in the overall championship. This comes courtesy of a faultless display at Snetterton in August in which the #12 driver

recorded two impressive victories. Alex Miller currently sits second overall and will be keen to narrow the gap to Lee out front, as will Simon Fleet in third and John Langridge in fourth. With four races left of the season and a large number of points still to fight for, it could go right down to the wire! In NA Class, Turner Property Services Racing's Liam Cochrane has enjoyed a stellar campaign and the Mk1 driver will be hoping to all but seal his class title at Oulton Park.

Not only did Declan Lee manage to snatch the championship lead at Snetterton, but the Hills Motorsport driver also became the fourth different competitor to top SuperPole in as many races! Will we incredibly see a fifth different MX-5 top the session in Cheshire? Only time will tell!

We have little doubt that Oulton Park's International layout will be the perfect platform for Mk1 and Mk3 Mazda MX-5s to excel on, with the picturesque circuit boasting an array of surging straights and tricky corners to compliment the might of the roadster's machinery.



DESCRIPTION

Miata Trophy is a one make Championship for the mk1 and mk3 Mazda MX-5. Racing together yet scoring points separately, allows cars from either class to take the overall championship title.

RACES

Two 20 minute sprint races follow a 15 minute qualifying, and the SuperPole session, a one lap dash to determine the top five grid positions in each class!

POINTS AND REWARDS

Points will be awarded to competitors listed as classified finishers within their class as follows: 50, 47, 44, 42, 40, 38, 36, 34, 32, 30, 28, 26, 24 then decreasing by 2 points down the results until 24th in class where by all remaining classified finishers in class will receive 2 points. Points will also be allocated to the top three in each class from the qualifying session, and for the fastest lap of the race in each class. Reduced points totals will be applied to classes with less than ten starters.

SPECIFICATION

Control parts include, control tyre Toyo Proxes R888R tyre for the mk3 MX-5 NC class, and a pre-buffed Toyo Proxes TR1 for the mk1 MX-5 NA class, and control GAZ Gold coilovers suspension, amongst other items. Further details can be found on the Miata Trophy website.

FLAGS

BLUE (STEADY)

Another competitor is close.

BLUE (WAVED)

Another competitor is trying to pass.

WHITE

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit.

YELLOW (WAVED)

Danger, slow down sufficiently to ensure that full control of the vehicle can be retained. No overtaking.

YELLOW (DOUBLE WAVED)

Great danger. Slow down considerably. Be prepared to suddenly change from the projected racing line, or take other evasive action including stopping if necessary. No overtaking. (This signal may be supplemented or replaced by flashing yellow light(s), as an added warning).

YELLOW/RED STRIPES

Slippery surface ahead.

GREEN (WAVED)

All dear, at the end of a danger area controlled by yellow flags. Also used to signal the start of a formation lap and shown at all posts during first lap of each practice session and during the formation lap.

RED

STOP RACING, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by marshals (at startline & individual marshal's posts). Race stopped.

BLACK/ORANGE DISK

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to driver; call into pits immediately.

BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL


Warning to driver that his/her behaviour (e.g. corner cutting) is suspect and he/her may be black flagged.

BLACK

Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.

BLACK & WHITE CHEQUERED

End of the race.
