

Ford Focus ST250 Mk3.5. A 303bhp petrol remapped by CC Tuning, with a healthy list of modifications and quality performance parts from well known partners — some already loyal providers to Focus Cup.

Gravity Performance exhaust & sports cat Direnza intercooler & intake Quaife ATB Differential Nankang CR-5 235/40/18 tyres ABS Motorsport composite wide front end and rear arches And much, much more.

CLASS 2

The Ford Focus 2.0TDCi Zetec S 3 door. The torquey diesel engine packs enough punch to provide close, fun racing and being more economical to run keeps the budget reasonable. The Zetec S version has the rear diffuser, rear spoiler and side skirts as fitted to the ST model and looks fantastic with the twin 4" tail pipes and front wide body kit from ABS composite panels.

Fitted with a K&N filter and custom Direnza exhaust and with help from CC Tuning in Burton, performance has been enhanced to 175HP and 310 lb/ft. The car's handling has been taken care of with a set of specially designed dampers from AST Suspension in Holland, Powerflex adjustable rear bushes for more rear camber and wider offset wheels with Nankang Tyres. All this finished off with a Safety devices rollcage, HEL braided hoses, Lifeline extinguisher system and of course - Mintex brake pads.

POINTS AND REWARDS

During qualifying competitors will be awarded points per their classified times. Starting with fastest time earning 30 pts, second fastest 26 pts, third fastest 23 and fourth fastest earning 21 pts. In descending order down the grid each driver then earns a point less so fifth will be 20 pts and sixth 19 pts and so on. Race points work exactly the same as qualifying bar fastest lap earns the driver a bonus five points.

TECH TALK









The Fine Cut Radical Cup UK returns to the MSVR paddock in 2025, delivering high-speed action on the UK's best Grand Prix circuits, along with an exciting summer round at Circuit Zandvoort. This season, the championship focuses solely on the SR3 model, with two-driver teams introduced to make racing more accessible and cost-effective.

Radical's latest SR3 XXR will take centre stage, alongside its predecessors - the SR3 RSX, SR3 XX, and SR3 XXR - ensuring competitive racing across multiple generations of this iconic model.

A major highlight for 2025 is the championships new title sponsorship - Fine Cut. Having long supported Radical Motorsport by producing race trophies and precision-cut components, their commitment strengthens the championship's prestige. We have also partnered with Wera Tools to support the next generation of racers, selecting drivers from the Wera Tools British Karting Championship to compete in this year's championship. This season also welcomes drivers from Radical's global "Race the World" programme, including Jack Yang and Andy Lowe, who race across multiple Radical Cup Championships worldwide.

2024 PRO SR1 Champion Marcus Littlewood dominated the opening round of the championship at Donington Park in his black and orange SR3 XXR, securing a commanding treble victory for RSR. Debutants Hamish Forrest and Rachel

Robertson impressed with consistent pace, while John MacLeod battled hard for three podium finishes. Behind them, thrilling midfield scraps saw Andy, Jack, and Alex Fisher all in the mix, with Rachel and Jack narrowly missing out on podiums. Marcus' flawless weekend firmly established him as the early championship favourite, with John MacLeod - who is currently contesting his 15th season with Radical, at the top of the Fangio standings.

Qualifying is on Saturday morning for 25-minutes from 09.30, with Sprint Race 1 at 13:00. There are then two races on Sunday, Sprint Race 2 at 11.40 and the 50-minute Endurance Race at 15.45.

For those interested in participating, a range of arrive and drive packages are available throughout the season. These packages are offered by experienced teams in the paddock, and details can be found on the Radical Cup UK website - radicalcup.uk.

The Radical Cup UK is a single-make championship, consisting of the world's best-selling race car, the Radical SR3. Purpose built from our factory in Peterborough, the SR3 comprises of a 1500cc RPE rear-mounted engine under lightweight bodywork and a tubular chassis.

Returning to the championship in 2025 is the reintroduction of two-driver teams, allowing drivers to share the cost, driving responsibilities, and excitement of competition. This format adds a new layer of strategy and teamwork, making the racing experience even more thrilling.

POINTS

Points are awarded to each championship contender, by the following, 80-70-60-54-28-44-40-36-32-28-24-20-18-16-14-12-10-8-6-4-2 with an additional two points for pole position and fastest lap, per race.

With four races under its belt already, Brands Hatch plays host to GT Cup rounds 5, 6, 7 and 8. Racers return to the championship's tried and tested format for Brands Hatch with a Sprint and Pit-Stop race contested both on Saturday and Sunday.

Follow a cracking series debut, Paddock Motorsport's Mark Smith comes into the weekend topping Group GT3 with fellow McLaren 720S driver Darren Kell nipping at his heels in second. Two further McLarens fill up the GT3 grid with Andrey Borodin and Ollie Webb aboard the #240 Greystone GT Machine and British GT's Optimum Motorsport making the most of the rare opportunity to run the full Brands Hatch layout. Peter Erceg's Audi R8 and G-Cat Racing's Porsche GTR round out the group.

Richard Chamberlain makes his delayed return to the GT Cup grid following an unscheduled absence at Donington Park. The unique, orange Porsche gives Paul Bailey and David Brabham an extra body to race against in Group GTO.

In Group GTC, Fraser Fenwick wasted no time in getting back to the top with new co-driver lain Campbell aboard their Topcats Racing Lamborghini Huracan. JMH Automotive's Frank Morris and James Pickford are their closest rivals, hoping to close the gap with some more solid results. Grahame Tilley is joined this weekend by Sennan Fielding after a pushbike accident put Will Tregurtha out

of action. Two newcomers, Peter Aronson and Michael McInerney join Group GTC, running with Topcats Racing and Team Parker Racing respectively.

James and Bill Caley had a fantastic first weekend of the season, seizing the lead of Group GTB thanks to some great results. PMT Motorsport's Tom Walpole more than proved himself in Donington Park's sprint races and has returned to take them on in his KTM X-BOW GT4.

Feathers Motorsport and SVG Motorsport both had brilliant results to start their season, but it's the Aston Martin in the hands of Archie Clark and Tom Canning that has stormed into the lead of Group GTH. Simon Griffiths and Hadley Simpson had a shaky start in the Innovation Racing with Cresta Ginetta G56, but with four more races this weekend, there are plenty of points up for grabs. New to the group this weekend is Oselli Motorsport, having swapped their Aston Martin Vantage for a current generation Vantage, jumping from Group GTA to GTH.


Speaking of GTA, both SVG Motorsport and Innovation Racing make an appearance here too. SVG's Neil Wallace and Ian Astley had a great showing at Donington Park and currently lead the group ahead of Innovation's Brent Millage. Anthony Seddon Racing's Lewis Tindall and Mack Priestwood also return to the grid hoping to improve on their Donington performance.



DESCRIPTION

Experience the thrill of multi-marque GT racing with unrivalled variety and performance balance.

The GT Cup Championship offers an exciting and competitive racing environment for GT cars across six performance-based Groups. This structure ensures fairness while showcasing a spectacular mix of machinery on the UK's most iconic circuits.

CLASSES

The grid is divided into six distinct Groups, each aligned to vehicle specification, age, and homologation:

GTO — Open specification cars including: Vehicles built by very low volume manufacturers (max 50 units), Cars built to GTE and GT2 specifications, Models not derived from mainstream GT production cars, GT3-specification vehicles no longer current GT3 — For current FIA-homologated GT cars running in accordance with the manufacturer's GT3 specification.

GTC — Modern Challenge and Cup cars (within the last 5 years), complying with current manufacturer Challenge regulations. Examples include Ferrari Challenge, Lamborghini Super Trofeo, and Porsche Cup.

GTB – Earlier generation Challenge and Cup cars (older than 5 years), and modified saloon-based GT vehicles from one-make series.



Brands Hatch is the spiritual home for Sports 2000 as it was here that circuit boss John Webb first introduced the series 48 years ago. Since then, there have been ups and downs but today the field features the original Ford Pinto engined cars as well as the latest evolution that has a modern Ford Duratec engine and downforce from a rear wing. All cars use the same Hoosier slick racing tyres and with nearly 30 cars on the grid there will be close battles throughout the race as drivers seek success in their classes. This year the faster Duratec engine cars will set off ten seconds ahead of the older cars so as to avoid unnecessary tangles up at Druids on the first lap. Even so over twenty cars into Paddock Hill bend should be quite a sight and the drivers will be looking forward to making the turn out onto the grand prix circuit at Surtees. Support for the series comes from Ancaster Leisure, JSE Systems, BMTR and Raceparts this year as well as battery supplier Varley Red Top, Vision Motorsport Engineering Products and KJG Photography.

Their season started at Silverstone where reigning champion Michael Gibbins scored a win in the first race but retired from the lead near the end of race two after a wishbone failure allowing Josh Law through for the race win. They can be expected to be at the front of the pack here at Brands Hatch but strong challenges are likely to come from Tim Tudor, Richard Johnson and Ben Cater in MCR cars. Colin Peach and Josh Needham took the class B laurels at Silverstone with a win apiece and both are likely

to be well up the results sheets again today. The Derek Bell class for more mature drivers is likely to be a battle between the MCRs of Peter Williams, Steve Ough and Roger Donnan with Andy Chittenden rejoining the fray after missing Silverstone.

The older Pinto engined cars may not be as numerous, have the power or downforce of the wing bedecked cars but they are still seriously quick cars. Nik Johnson's Lola set the pace at Silverstone setting a new lap record and earning the driver of the day award. Peter Needham in a Van Diemen will provide a strong challenge and it will be interesting to see how Gary Fry and Ollie Plunkett go on their series debuts in a Lola and a Tiga run by Pegasus Racing. Patrick Clifton seemed to settle quickly on his debut in the Tiga and will be looking to make a mark again here at Brands. The fastest Pinto cars often challenge the Duratec cars on some parts of the track adding further excitement as the leading cars begin to catch them towards the end of the race. Safe passes with minimal delay are all part of the skillset for \$2000 drivers.

For those interested in records the lap record for the faster Duratec cars was set by Josh Law two years ago with a time of 1.28.228 while the Historics record was set by Jon Harmer at 1.35.561 in a Tiga also in 2023. If the weather gods smile on us both of those records could fall this weekend. Big grids, close racing, fast cars and a friendly paddock is exactly what John Webb would have hoped for when the series started and he'd be delighted to see them still going strong today.





BRANDS HATCH CIRCUIT

BLUE (STEADY)

Another competitor is close.

BLUE (WAVED)

Another competitor is trying to pass.

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit.

YELLOW (WAVED)

Danger, slow down sufficiently to ensure that full control of the vehicle can be retained. No overtaking.

YELLOW (DOUBLE WAVED)

Great danger. Slow down considerably. Be prepared to suddenly change from the projected racing line, or take other evasive action including stopping if necessary. No overtaking, (This signal may be supplemented or replaced by flashing yellow light(s), as an added

YELLOW/RED STRIPES

Slippery surface ahead.

GREEN (WAVED)

All clear, at the end of a danger area controlled by yellow flags. Also used to signal the start of a formation lap and shown at all posts during first lap of each practice session and during the formation lap.

RED

STOP RACING, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by marshals (at startline & individual marshal's posts). Race stopped.

BLACK/ORANGE DISK

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to driver; call into pits immediately.

BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL


Warning to driver that his/her behaviour (e.g. corner cutting) is suspect and he/her may be black flagged.

BLACK

Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.

BLACK & WHITE CHEOUERED

End of the race.
