

TECH TALK









Miata Trophy's is on the home straight in 2025, with Cadwell Park set to host the penultimate meeting of the championship's season on Saturday 6 September.

The tremendous circuit, nestled within the Lincolnshire Wolds, is one that offers a variety of challenges that competitors will have to master if they're to come away with a strong points haul.

A large number of undulation changes add to what is already a tricky 18-corner layout, with the likes of 'Gooseneck' and 'The Mountain' standout tests. The section of track containing the tight, twisting 'Hall Bends', along with 'Hairpin' and 'Barn' should not be taken lightly, as it's instrumental in ensuring that competitors both end their previous lap and start their new lap in as strong fashion possible.

While Rounds 11 & 12 at Cadwell Park will certainly challenge, they will also reward. Those drivers who demonstrate well-thought out and consistent race craft will likely find themselves in the battle for the podium trophies and the big point-scoring positions, at a crucial time in the championship.

As things stand, Hills Motorsport's Aidan Hills is the driver to beat at the top of the Miata Trophy standings. The #8 driver recorded an impressive double victory at Oulton Park last time out and will be looking to continue in a similar vein in Lincolnshire, to remain the driver on top when the championship heads into its Brands Hatch finale in November.

However, there are a number of previous race winners and

podium finishers on the early Cadwell Park entry list all looking to challenge Hills at the front.

Amongst those are James Cossins, Declan Lee, Jack Brewer and Oliver Allwood, who all sit finely poised within the top five of the championship standings. Reigning Champion John Langridge and teammate Alex Miller are two more who know what it takes to finish on the podium and set to feature, alongside a host of other drivers all keen to make their mark.


To add to the excitement of Miata Trophy's penultimate meeting, the championship will be taking centre stage at Cadwell Park for one of the circuit's feature events. Cult Classics celebrates the unique charm and character of the most beloved classic motors, meaning there will be an eclectic mix of shows cars and spectators in attendance on the day.

Two 20 minute sprint races follow a 15 minute qualifying session.

POINTS AND REWARDS

Points will be awarded to competitors listed as classified finishers within their class as follows: 50, 47, 44, 42, 40, 38, 36, 34, 32, 30, 28, 26, 24 then decreasing by 2 points down the results until 24th in class where by all remaining classified finishers in class will receive 2 points. Points will be allocated for the fastest lap in each race and to each driver who crosses the control line in the overall lead during the race.

We're into the second half of the 2025 Trackday Championship season!

Cadwell Park is up next on Saturday 6 September, when the championship will play a starring role in the circuit's popular 'Cult Classics' event. It'll be a fantastic day for competitors, who will vie for both the points and podium trophies, on a day designed to celebrate and welcome a large number of beloved classic motors.

Heading into the meeting its Matt Swaffer, Dan Abbitt and Stephen Docker who pave the way in their respective class championship standings.

Swaffer has recorded an impressive three podium finishes in the opening four races so far this season, including victory last time out at Oulton Park. The BMW 130i driver will be looking to repeat his success at Cadwell Park to continue leading Class B, but it won't be easy with the likes of Nicole Drought (Motion Motorsport), Wright/Glover (Clubracer) and Wright/Wright (Team Air Supply) all amongst the entry.

Following some excellent results so far this year, Abbitt Motorsport's Dan Abbitt currently leads both the overall and Class C championship standings. The Honda Integra driver will be keen to record another podium at Cadwell Park, though class rivals such as Wayne Cockerill (Aindale Racing) and Colin Murphy (Algar Racing) will be hoping to have their own say.

Following a superb class victory in Round 4, Docker will be looking to add to his impressive string of results in Round 5. The Independent driver has amassed a decent gap to his rivals in the standings, but will need to be on form if he is to finish ahead of drivers such as Alister Esam (BC Cars Motorsport) and Steven Orant (STAL Powered for Racing).

Cadwell Park will provide a challenge for both experienced racers and novices alike, but while this is the case, it's also a circuit that will also offer plenty in the way of thrills. Fondly likened to a 'mini-Nürburgring', the circuit winds its way around the Lincolnshire Wolds, combining a tight woodlands section with a more-flowing parkland section. There are a number of epic corners that should be on the bucket list of all UK racers, most notably The Mountain and Gooseneck.


This is not going to be a race to miss!

Trackday Championship's established weekend format remains in place for the 2025 season, with a 25-minute qualifying session proceeding a 45-minute race. The race itself will include a mandatory two-minute pit stop for all teams.

DESCRIPTION

The Trackday Championship is the graduate championship for Trackday Trophy drivers and other more experienced competitors in production and production-based sports and saloon cars. Further details can be found on the Trackday Championship website.

RACES

Races are designed for teams of two drivers so that the costs of running the car can be shared, together with the excitement! Classes are determined on a power-to-weight ratio and each race will be 45-minutes in length and preceded by a 25-minute qualifying session. These races will include a pit stop and allow for driver changes.

POINTS AND REWARDS

Points will be awarded to competitors listed as classified finishers in the final results as follows: 30, 27, 24, 20, 18, 16, 14, 12, 10, 8, 6, 4, 3, 2, 1, plus 1 for single fastest lap in qualifying or race. A maximum of 5 points will be added for cars beaten in class.

TEAMS

Teams can be made up of two drivers or solo entries. All teams must complete a pit-stop during the pit-stop window of between 15 minutes and 30 minutes into the race. All teams must complete two minute pit stop.

SPECIFICATION

Regulations for the series are reasonably relaxed to accommodate a wide range of vehicles.

TECH TALK









Cadwell Park will host the opening two rounds of the
2025 Reprise IT Tiedeman Trophy Championship.

The Founder of the Monoposto Racing Club, Frank Tiedeman, passed away in 2013 and so a new Autumn Championship was established that year bearing his name. Frank was a prominent advocate of low-cost single seater racing, which is the objective of the Tiedeman Trophy – to offer cost effective racing at the end of the season. Each meeting is a single day, single grid, double header format to keep costs down.

The scoring system is such that each driver scores points for their position in class and then scores an additional point per person in their class. All classes then score against each other to make one overall winner per meeting and the overall champion. Therefore, the Tiedeman Champion could come from any one of our eight classes.

Entries for Cadwell Park are unfortunately rather thin on the ground, however the drivers should still pull out some exciting racing. With it being the first two rounds of the championship, it is all to play for.

The biggest class is the Moto 1000 class for bike engined single seaters up to one litre. Therefore, the overall winner of the meeting is likely to come from this class. Matthew

Haughton is fresh off the back of his third consecutive class championship for Moto 1000 in the Monoposto Championship and he will be looking to make it a double crown this season.

Matthew will have strong competition though as previous class winners Dan Levy and Tony Gauntlett will be joining him in the class. They will also be joined by two Leastone Racing drivers, Morgan McCourt and Roisin Sweeney, who are coming over from Ireland for the meeting. This is the first time the Irish team have joined us this season.

Tom Wheatley will be one to watch in the F3B class, he too has just won his class championship in the Monoposto Championship and will be looking to score some good points here to place in the Tiedeman too. He will be joined by Malcolm Scott in the F3B class.

Phil Chappell and Eddie Guest will be representing the Classic class, with Terry Clark the sole entrant in the 2000 class and Kyle Wallace for the 1600 class. Kyle has just won the 1600 class championship in the Monoposto Championship on his third year of trying and will be looking for reliability this weekend to set him up for a good run in the Tiedeman Trophy too.



Cadwell Park is the venue for the sixth round of Trackday Trophy's 2025 season, with the series playing its part in the on-track entertainment for the popular Cult Classics event on Saturday 6 September.

Curated to celebrate beloved motors, from hot hatches to boxy classics and everything in-between, Cult Classics will welcome an eclectic mix of display cars to the venue and provide an exciting backdrop for the next instalment of Trackday Trophy fun.

The series, fresh from celebrating its 100th race at Oulton Park last time out, will bring an expected bumper grid to Lincolnshire and provide spectators with plenty of entertainment.

Brothers Luke and Chris Reade (Wolf Motorsport) and Team Air Supply #64's Wright/Allatt both finished on the Class B podium at the landmark race at Oulton Park and will be hoping to challenge for the top spots once more, while Alister Esam (BC Cars Motorsport) will be aiming to secure another Class D victory.

There are plenty of other competitors who will be aiming to secure the podium trophies in each of the three classes though and you can expect an action-packed 45-minute race.

Amongst others, Aindale Racing's Wayne Cockerill and Hobson Racing's Sarah Hobson will both be looking for strong results

in their Toyota Celicas, while Trevor Hurrell and George Wright will be aiming for the same in their respective Honda Civic and Citroen Saxo.

Cadwell Park has remained a favoured track for many competitors, for its ability to challenge and excite in equal measure. The 'mini-Nürburgring' will reward competitors who demonstrate skilled race craft and determination to overcome all the tests that the wooded parkland circuit offers.

While 'The Mountain' and 'Gooseneck' are rightly famed for their tough-yet-exhilarating nature, corners like 'Charlies' at the beginning of the lap offer a similar experience. It's here that drivers will need to nail both their entry and exits to carry as much speed as possible up the undulating 'Park Straight'. From there, the rush of descending your way through the Lincolnshire Wolds into the challenging woodland section awaits!

2025 marks an impressive milestone for Trackday Trophy, as the series fifteenth year since inception.

Races continue to be designed with a mandatory pit-stop to give opportunity for two-driver teams to share the cost and excitement, with each race meeting comprised of a 25-minute qualifying session and 45-minute race on the same day to help reduce overnight costs.

DESCRIPTION

MSVT Trackday Trophy is a series designed for production and production based Saloon, Hatchback and Sports cars. Aimed at trackday drivers, TDT is designed to help introduce newcomers to the world of motorsport.

RACES

Races are designed for teams of two drivers so that the costs of running the car can be shared, together with the excitement! Classes are determined on a power-to-weight ratio and each event consists of 25 minutes practice/qualifying, followed by a 45 minute race, both of which will take place on one day to reduce overnight costs.

The MSVT Trackday Trophy is run as a series, so there are no championship points.

SPECIFICATION

Snetterton Saloons adds an extra 'Away Day' with this rare visit to Cadwell Park for the penultimate event of the season.

Most, but not all, competitors are East Anglian based; choosing to race with Snetterton Saloons due to our consistently high driving standards; friendly paddock; great value and competitive classes; not to mention the convenience of a (normally) local race series. Membership isn't obligatory and guests are most welcome to dip in and out of the series.

The standard race format is one/two driver 45/50 minute pit-stop races, with a rolling start. Pit Stops must be taken between 15 & 30 minutes of race duration and last a minimum of 90 seconds 'pit-in to pit-out' with punitive penalties for short stopping or missing the pit window. Single drivers are not expected to exit the car.

This event, however, follows the alternative 20 minute double sprint format; pandering to the elderly, unfit and easily distracted driver who suffers in the usual 45minute race.

Regulations are kept as simple as possible; with classes broadly defined by engine size; but multipliers applied for various modifications and specifications; plus a class upgrade for racing slick/wet tyres. Despite the series name, we welcome coupe, convertible and selected sports cars on a car-by-car basis.

The Series could not run without the terrific support of our main sponsor; Uncle Luke's Sign & Sticker shop. Owner, Luke Allen, often campaigns his Golf TCR but is, at the time of writing, contemplating dusting off his Honda Civic for this event.

Matthew Payne of co-sponsor, SCS Delta, is hoping to be out this

weekend in his roly-poly Metro, it's surprisingly agile despite its 2CVesque cornering gait.

New sponsor, Aaron Reeve of A Reeve Performance is also making his maiden race start with Snetterton Saloons to kick off a partnership offering driver benefits as well as exposure for their successful business.

Predicting the race leaders is likely to be based on the look of the skies overhead, with fast Class C cars such as Ray Honeybone in his Clio likely to be up the front in damp conditions. Otherwise, look out for Jas Sapra and Simon Donoghue in their M3's as leaders of the pack.

Previous race winner, (in his BMW M3) David Marcussen, all the way from Bath, will compete in his Class C Renault Clio: arguably better suited to the twists and turns of Cadwell Park; no doubt picking up the lines from the experienced Honeybone and chasing down the fast Megane James Gough.

The Hornigold father & son team should also be competitive in their Class D MG ZR; especially as they'll have track advantage from additional races on the same day

With clean, affordable and competitive racing for a wide variety of cars from production spec Mk2 Golf GTi's to TCR cars; Snetterton Saloons has become the favoured home for many racers enjoying the purposely limited grid sizes (for safety) and the paddock atmosphere; this year has seen a record membership.



On Sunday 7 September, the beloved EnduroKA returns to the track to kickstart the second half of its 2025 season in style in Lincolnshire.

BLUE (STEADY)

Another competitor is close.

BLUE (WAVED)

Another competitor is trying to pass.

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit.

YELLOW (WAVED)

Danger, slow down sufficiently to ensure that full control of the vehicle can be retained. No overtaking.

YELLOW (DOUBLE WAVED)

Great danger. Slow down considerably. Be prepared to suddenly change from the projected racing line, or take other evasive action including stopping if necessary. No overtaking, (This signal may be supplemented or replaced by flashing yellow light(s), as an added

YELLOW/RED STRIPES

Slippery surface ahead.

GREEN (WAVED)

All clear, at the end of a danger area controlled by yellow flags. Also used to signal the start of a formation lap and shown at all posts during first lap of each practice session and during the formation lap.

RED

STOP RACING, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by marshals (at startline & individual marshal's posts). Race stopped.

BLACK/ORANGE DISK

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to driver; call into pits immediately.

BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL


Warning to driver that his/her behaviour (e.g. corner cutting) is suspect and he/her may be black flagged.

BLACK

Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.

BLACK & WHITE CHEOUERED

End of the race.
